Directions: Regular Play

 Place nine cards face down on the table in front of the student(s). (Make sure there is one card representing each of the nine different shapes: square, heart, diamond, circle, triangle, rectangle, octagon, star, and oval.)



- 2. Let a student roll the double dice.
- The student determines the shape on the outer die and turns over the corresponding card.
- The student determines the number on the inner die and reads (or listens as you read) the corresponding statement.
- 5. The student responds to the statement by listing the similarities or differences.
- A token can be given for reinforcement for a correct answer (optional).
- The card is returned face down to its original place on the table.
- 8. The next student rolls the double dice.
- 9. This continues until all tokens are given out or time runs out.
