Book Summary

Twelve-year-old Fishel (Fish) Rosner doesn't like regular "boy" things. He hates sports and would rather read or do crafts than climb trees or ride dirt bikes with his friends. Fish also loves to dance. But everything he wants to do is considered "girly." Fish doesn't get why that's a bad thing. He's just interested in different things than other boys. When he asks his Bubby to teach him to knit, she tells him to go play outside. When he begs his mom to take him to Zumba, she enrolls him in water polo instead. Why does everyone else get to decide what Fish should or shouldn't do?

Read-Aloud Suggestions

- p. 10—"I love ice cream…" Fish is surprised to get pushback when he asks his grandmother to teach him to knit. Especially because of *why* she won't teach him
- p. 23—"By lunchtime, I was getting pretty nervous…" Fish discovers even his best friend has strong, negative opinions about who should knit.
- p. 61—"Later that night, we were all at the kitchen table…" Fish is faced with a situation where he can either admit he didn't go to the activity his mom had signed him up for or cover up his actions with a lie.

Discussion Questions


- 1. Fish faces pushback from friends and family, even though he knows in his heart that the things he wants to do shouldn't be "for boys" or "for girls." Have you ever felt or been told you shouldn't do something for the same reason? What happened? How did you feel?
- 2. Fish struggles with finding a charity (bar mitzvah) project that's meaningful to him. What would your charity project be and why?
- 3. Why do you think Seth was so angry about Fish wanting to learn how to knit?
- 4. Fish didn't tell his family that he went to Zumba instead of water polo—was he justified in that? Should he have told them?
- 5. What character do you identify with most in this book? Why?
- 6. There is mention of stereotypes in this book. Discuss other stereotypes and why they might be hurtful.


Activities

- 1. Create a new cover for Fish Out of Water.
