

The Creature in The Forest

What is scaring away the campers at Chimney Rock State Forest? Some people say a big creature lives in the forest, but Scoop and Jake are going to find out for themselves.

The Smoke Bomber

The excitement of a political campaign comes to Big Bend, but so does a threat. Will Scoop and Jake get to the bottom of the story before anyone gets hurt?

The Runaway

A mother asks Scoop to help find her missing son. Jake and Scoop get worried when they find out that Red Grogan is involved. How will they find this boy and keep him out of trouble?

The Missing Trophy

In a blast from the past, Scoop's champion high school trophy goes missing. He and his intern, Jake go back to school to find the story behind the disappearance of the missing trophy.

Vocabulary Words: backpack, computer, baseball, college, championship, league, trophy, steal, editor, janitor, handyman, basement, solve, coach, brag

The Poisoned River

What's killing all the fish at Scoop's favorite spot on the river? What started as a relaxing weekend has turned into a big story-one with a thrilling end.

Vocabulary Words: bait, poison, health officer, clues, upstream, downstream, security guard, waste, chemicals, tanker,

A glossary is included in each book, following the Table of Contents.



*Extending the Vocabulary:

- Use the *Word Map* to help students to reinforce their recognition of new vocabulary words.
- As you introduce the vocabulary words, have students work in pairs or groups, and assign one or two words to each group, pass out copies of the *Word Map*, and ask students to add their vocabulary word/s to their *Word Map*.
- Provide an example for them on the board or on an overhead projector. Place or write the word *intern* in the middle square; ask students to define the word, (students can use the dictionary to find the appropriate definition) "a student or graduate usually in a professional field gaining supervised practical experience." Discuss and determine which definition is the best, making sure that the definition relates to the story. Then write it in the square above the word. On the board or transparency ask the class for a sentence using the word, intern. My brother is an intern at St. John's Hospital downtown. Discuss the sentence and how it relates to Jake in the story. See if your students can think of other sentences that are appropriate. Write those sentences in the box at the bottom of the page.
- Ask students what a synonym is. *Synonyms are words that are very close in meaning* (example: happy/glad).
- See if students can think of a synonym for the word *intern*. Discuss, and ask students to review the definition to help (example: student teacher). Place answer in the box designated on the *word map*.
- Ask students what an antonym is. *Antonyms are words that are opposite in meaning* (example: hot/cold, up/down). Students may have difficulty finding opposites for some words; you may want to discuss why some words do not have antonyms. *The word intern has other meanings when used in a different context; discuss this with students and review other definitions of the word, explaining to them that using the word in a different context, the word may have an antonym.*
- Now it's your students' turn. Using the assigned words and the word map, students will follow your example and find and write the right definitions, sentences, synonyms and antonyms in the identified spaces. Students will introduce their work to the whole group and discuss their answers.



Vocabulary Enrichment

Students need to be actively involved with new vocabulary words. Provide playful opportunities for your students to interact with the words and process the meaning for immediate feedback.

- Ask questions that reinforce the meaning of the new vocabulary words. Jim acts like a clown.
- Provide *sentence starters* to apply the meaning of the word in a different context.

 Tell students that you are going to start a sentence and you want them to think of an ending. *Sarah looked like a clown when she...*
- Help the students to understand that they can add these new words to their own vocabularies. Provide opportunities for your students to use these words as part of their own experiences.

When was the last time you went to the circus? Describe the clowns and what they were doing.
