


Introduction

The ability to ask and answer WH questions is important for a developing communicator. Webber® WH Photo Cards targets both receptive and expressive WH questions. Each card includes a photo and a 2-3 sentence story. Also included are WH questions Who, What, When, Where, and Why— 5 receptive WH questions and 5 expressive WH questions on each card.

Receptive questions target the student's ability to recall information from the 2-3 sentence story. Expressive questions encourage students to generate novel responses based solely on the picture. Work on answering receptive and expressive WH questions, auditory memory, question-asking skills, generating narratives, and more!







The scientists are making a potion to make homework disappear. At the lab table, Ms. Clark is pouring the blue liquid. When mixed together, the yellow liquid changes to green!


- Who is pouring the blue liquid?


Receptive
