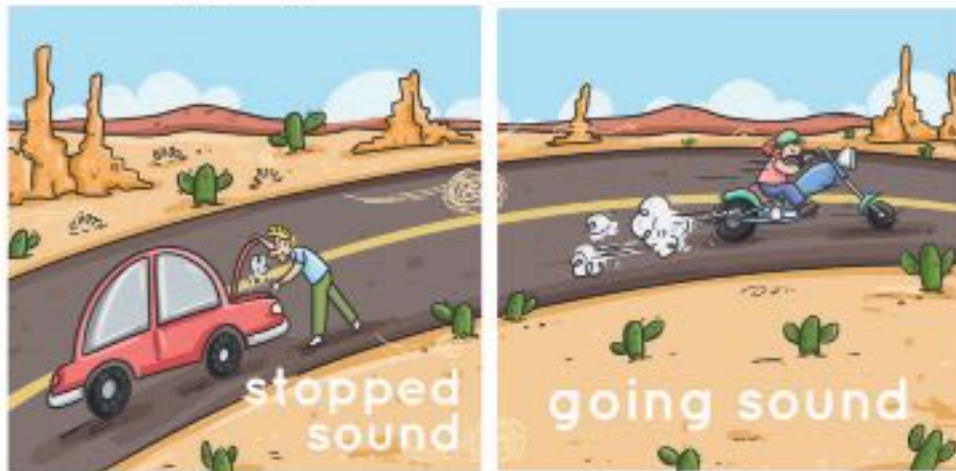

Cue #3 Stopped Sound vs. Going Sound

for stopping of fricatives and affricates



(The cards are designed to join together to make a continuous picture. You might remove a card the going card if the child stops their sound.)

Suggested teaching: Some sounds feel like the air stops short when we say them, like 'd'. Other sounds go for a longer time, like 's'. We call these our going sounds.

Stopped Sounds are 'p', 't', 'k', 'b', 'd', and 'g'.
Going Sounds are 's', 'sh', 'z', 'f', 'v', 'ch' and 'j'.
