How to enjoy this book

The final six books in The Adventures of Pip and Tim series allow children to practise their alphabetic and morphological knowledge while building their vocabulary, general knowledge, comprehension and fluency. Children will enjoy reading Pip and Tim's blog about their family trip around Australia. It gives many opportunities for discussion and research about Australia's history and geography.

Morphology: Where are Pip and Tim? is written in the past tense so many words need an ed suffix. The interesting fact is that ed has three different phonemes (sounds).

- as in expected two phonemes /e/ and /d/ (adds an extra syllable to the word)
- as in disappeared one phoneme /d/
- as in jumped one phoneme /t/

Speed words: These words give children practice in reading words with the suffix ed. This page can be photocopied, and the words cut up and sorted according to the sound represented by the suffix ed.
