

Pronunciation Guide

Regular past tense verbs are written by adding "ed" to the verb. They are however, pronounced three different ways. Here are the general rules:

- If the last consonant is unvoiced, then the "ed" marking the past tense is pronounced as /t/.
- If the last consonant is voiced, then the "ed" marking the past tense is pronounced as /d/ and the vowel has a longer duration.
- If the word ends in a /d/ or /t/ sound, then "ed" marking the past tense is pronounced /ɪd/.

This double dice deck separates the three different ways of articulating the regular past tense endings, so that therapy may be more productive and consistent. The *Content Card* is color-coded to assist you in differentiating the three ways in which the verbs in this card deck are articulated. It is also alphabetized within each section to help you find the verbs you are desiring to target in therapy.
